

Răzvan Stoica

Biography

Răzvan Stoica is one of the most appreciated young violonists of our time. He played as solo with worldwide famed orchestras and conductors. Among his major projects there are the concerts with the Südwestdeutsche Philharmonic Orchestra - Germany (2017), Slovenian Philharmonic Orchestra (2013), Dutch Philharmonic Orchestra (2018), Sanremo Symphonic Orchestra (2019), Slovenian Radio Orchestra (2018), Romanian National Radio Orchestra (2018), George Enescu Philharmonic Orchestra - Bucharest (2018), as also Beethoven Academic Orchestra (2019), Essen Philharmonic Orchestra (2018) and Trondheim Symphonic Orchestra (2019).

A winner of NEW TALENT Competition - Bratislava prize and of Competition *Best under 28 violonist in Europe*, in 2013, famed for virtuosity, passion and wondrous interpretation, Răzvan Stoica has set a solid foundation for a majestic career, his charisma capturing both his audiences and the media. An impassioned player already in young age, Răzvan studied at George Enescu Music High School – Bucharest, where he had the privilege to study with great artists such as Olivia Papa, Ștefan Gheorghiu and Modest Ifinchi, as also (later) with Ilya Grubert, in the Royal Conservatory – Amsterdam, Netherlands., and Leonidas Kavakos, Krzysztof Wegrzyn, Vadim Repin, Itzhak Perlman, Ivry Gitlis and Pinchas Zuckerman, in various master classes sessions.

Răzvan won 24 national and international prizes in prestigious competitions, like (several) Violin Olympics in România, Perosi Competition, and Duo Competition Bolzano. His winning (in 2009) of the Great Prize in Strad Prize Competiton - Salzburg, Austria, also brought Răzvan a priceless Antonius Stradivarius 1729 violin. Today Răzvan plays as solo with various European orchestras, and in chamber music concerts, with pianist Andreea Stoica.
